EUPeace Handbook: Advancing 'School for All' Through Internationalising Teacher Education

The newly released *EUPeace Handbook on Internationalising Teacher Education* is a comprehensive guide designed to extend the EUPeace concept of "School for All" by integrating international perspectives into teacher education. Grounded in frameworks like the Council of Europe's RFCDC, it offers strategies, practical examples, and curriculum modules to help educators foster global competence and intercultural understanding.

Highlighting the benefits of internationalised teacher training—such as enhanced cultural awareness and improved educational outcomes—the handbook also addresses key challenges and calls for institutional support, technology use, and ongoing professional development. It is an essential resource for advancing peace, justice, and inclusive education across borders.

Launching the European Track: EUPeace's New Interdisciplinary Certificate for 2025/26

Launching in the 2025/26 academic year, the *European Track* is EUPeace's new cross- and interdisciplinary certificate programme for students across its partner universities. Approved by the EUPeace Education Board, the pilot phase features over 150 diverse courses—including virtual, hybrid, and in-person options—delivered through the Virtual European Exchange Programme (VEEP) and Erasmus+ mobility. Covering a wide disciplinary range, from intercultural communication to environmental sustainability and social justice, the programme offers students the chance to earn certificates at three levels (6–18 ECTS). Course proposals for the autumn/winter semester 2025/26 are welcome until 16 June 2025.

Expanding Horizons: EUPeace Moves Forward with Joint Master's Programme Pilots in Humanities, STEM, and Security Studies

The EUPeace Alliance is actively advancing plans for joint Master's programmes, with two pilot degrees in development—one in the humanities and social sciences, and another in STEM—built upon the European Track, Research Hubs, and the Living Peace Lab. A recent online event detailed progress on a joint Master's in Security and Conflict Transformation, involving Marburg, Comillas, Çukurova, and Sarajevo universities. Additional initiatives include a Water Resources Management programme ("Water4All") and planned expert workshops in International Economics, Business, and Al. Opportunities for collaboration and seed funding via the EUPeace Fund's Fourth Call (deadline: 30 June 2025) are also available.

Research Funding Spotlights for the EUPeace Newsletter!

EUPeace Research Hubs gather interdisciplinary experts around shared themes to foster collaboration and explore EU funding opportunities that can extend the Alliance's impact beyond its current project. Functioning like consortia, these hubs create an ideal setting for joint research and innovation efforts. To support this goal, a "Funding Spotlight" section has been launched on the EUPeace website, highlighting relevant funding calls and set to expand throughout 2025 with both national and international opportunities. One major funding source is the Horizon Europe Work Programme 2025, which allocates over €7.2 billion to support EU priorities such as sustainability, digitalisation, resilience, and democratic inclusion. Funding is divided into six thematic clusters ranging from health and cultural inclusion to digital transformation, civil security, climate action, and sustainable agriculture. Specific calls and application details are already available online, with first calls opened

since mid-May. Details for cluster-specific calls for the 2025 funding cycle can now be found at: Horizon Europe work programmes - European Commission.

EUPeace welcomes "Choose Europe for Science" Call by President Macron and President Von der Leyen, Driving Innovation Through Alliances

EUPeace actively participated in the "Choose Europe for Science" event held on 5 May 2025 in Paris, being represented by Prof. Dr. Evelyn Korn and Prof. Zoran Tomić. The Alliance supports President Macron's call to welcome international scientists, particularly young researchers, into a European space grounded in academic freedom. EUPeace aligns closely with the scientific priorities outlined by President Macron and President Von der Leyen—such as AI, climate, and health—which reflect the focus of its own Research Hubs. Committed to fostering peace through research, education, and societal outreach, EUPeace continues to champion academic freedom and support scholars facing restrictions. The Alliance will closely examine the announced initiatives and is already establishing connections with researchers who may be hosted at member universities. Building on prior support for displaced academics, EUPeace also engaged in discussions with EU leaders on the future of Alliances and reiterated the need for a long-term investment strategy for all missions of universities and Alliances

UNSA Hosts 2nd "Living Peace Lab" Workshop on Intersectional Discrimination, Advancing Peer Education for Violence Prevention

On 22 April 2025, the University of Sarajevo's Human Rights Center hosted the second workshop of the "Living Peace Lab: Developing Peer Education Initiatives" project, focusing on intersectional discrimination. Bringing together students from diverse study programmes, the workshop aimed to empower youth in addressing the roots of

violence through educational tools. In line with EUPeace Alliance principles, the initiative was developed in collaboration with NGO "Cure" and the Agency for Gender Equality of Bosnia and Herzegovina—both part of the soon-to-be-established Social Dialogue Group at UNSA. This event, the second in a planned five-part series, highlights the vital role of youth-centered, dialogue-based education in promoting social change and combating violence.

Scaling Up Erasmus+ and Easing Mobility for a Stronger Democratic Europe

On 29 April 2025, Marburg University hosted a panel titled "Shaping the Future of Democracy through Science" as part of the Europe Weeks in Germany, bringing together political leaders, university representatives, and students to discuss the vital role of universities and European University Alliances in defending academic freedom and fostering democracy. Participants emphasised the importance of structural support for Alliances, greater funding—including a call to double the Erasmus+ budget and removing barriers to student mobility. They underlined that mobility should not only be expanded but also intentionally designed to support democratic engagement. EUPeace's initiatives, such as its Mobility Platform and student support systems, were highlighted as best practices. The event concluded with a call for Alliances to act as transformative spaces that strengthen European values and societal resilience.

Launched in 2005, the ESNsurvey has
